Underpinning Design and Delivery Principles

Impartial: Recognising the aim of the Future U programme is to help support the development of knowledge and skills that learners will need to help them to self-manage and sustain their learning, encourage their aspirations, appreciate the breadth of potential education and career options available to them and to make informed choices that take account of their personal abilities, needs and preferences.

Engagement with Key Influencers (Parents, Family, & Carers, Teachers, Ambassadors): Recognising that these potential influencers can be a significant source of inspiration, guidance and support to learners during their education journey and as they begin to contemplate their future education and career futures.

Interventions based upon Evidence and Planned Impact Assessment: Recognising that any interventions delivered are based upon the best available evidence of impact and we actively assess, monitor and evaluate the ongoing impact of interventions being supported by the Future U programme.

Sustained and Progressive wherever possible: Recognising that where activities being planned and supported are connected and delivered as a coherent programme of activities that this should have greater benefit and impact for learners.

Link to Gatsby Benchmarks: Recognising that we need to clearly indicate the key knowledge and skill areas that any interventions being supported and delivered by Future U to help schools and colleges in being able to plan and support the delivery of their careers strategy and programmes for their learners and evidence their application of national guidance in relation to this area of work.
